Coop set to carry momentum to year-end

AFPFC MPC marks strong performance in first half of 2025, surpasses midyear targets



The AFP Finance Center Multi-Purpose Cooperative (AFPFC MPC) is on track for strong growth this year, driven by a remarkable midyear performance across its key areas reflecting surge in loan production, robust membership growth, and sustained collection efficiency.

The results, reviewed on July 18, 2025, highlight the Cooperative's operational success and strategic execution for 2025.

During the Cooperative's Mid-Year Assessment, AFPFC MPC Chairman of the Board MGEN RIZALDO B LIMOSO, expressed his optimism for AFPFC MPC's momentum to finish the year strong.

"The performance of our Cooperative has been remarkable this past six months and we are very optimistic that we will be able to sustain this until year end," said Chairman Limoso.

Talking about the prudent strategies employed for its laudable performance, Chairman Limoso noted that "there must always be continuous improvement," to stay ahead of its targets for the year.

Posted increase in total loan production

In terms of total loan production, AFPFC MPC has attained a 25.2% increase overall in the first semester of 2025 compared to the same period in 2024.

Translating to a total of P2.84 billion in gross loan releases, this squarely places the Cooperative at pace to surpass its accomplishments throughout the year.

The marked increase in performance highlights AFPFC MPC's consistent delivery of accessible, competitive, and member-focused financial solutions catering to the needs of its members.

Sustaining solid collection rates

AFPFC MPC continues to hold a respectable collection rate of more than 99%.

This number is a reflection of the Cooperative's continuous implementation of sound financial management and sustainability-and the collaboration with partner agencies designed to ensure the collection of loans extended to members.

Across-the-board membership growth

In the first semester of 2025, AFPFC MPC welcomed 3,206 new Kamay-Ari into its membership base-reaching a total of more than 46,200 Kamay-Ari.



Fueled by significant expansions to its membership through partnerships with the Office of Transportation Security and Municipal Government of Montalban, the number is a notable increase of 75.3% of the total number of new members enrolled in the same period last year.

Taken altogether, the notable achievements of AFPFC MPC in the first half of 2025 is a sign of carrying strong momentum to surpass its goals set for the year. It attests to the steps taken to broaden the mutual growth enjoyed by its members.

On July 16, 2024, AFPFC MPC officially launched its latest promotional product—the Back-to-Back Flexi Loan (BBFL), an offering designed to provide members with easier access to funds for members' evolving financial situations.

Through the BBFL, Kamay-Ari can now use up to 100% of their deposit account for loans at flexible terms-from 3 to 12 months with full payment upon maturity.

These features make it more convenient and easier for a member to meet their financial needs without having to deplete their deposit accounts.

With flexible payment terms, collateral-backed security, this newest loan product is a crucial step forward in AFPFC MPC's mission to deliver member-centered financial services catered to their needs.

BBFL is available on a limited time offer until December 31, 2025 only.

AFPFC MPC continues to strengthen its commitment as a dependable financial partner to its members by offering more flexible renewal terms. Since July 1, 2025, members aged 70 years old and below now enjoy earlier loan renewal privileges.

With the new policy, loan renewal is now available once 20% of the outstanding balance has been paid.

Under this adjustment, a member with a 5-year loan term will already be eligible for

Previously, members had to first settle at least 30% of their existing loan before they were able to apply for another loan renewal.

Haduan Negrito Integrated School

As part of the pre-anniversary activities of the Air Defense Command (ADC), AFPFC MPC took part in an outreach activity at Haduan Negrito Integrated School in Mabalacat City, Pampanga on August 15, 2025, highlighted by the distribution of essential supplies and food items for students.

Bringing together program partners, the activity brought participants through challenging trails before arriving at the school to extend support to Indigenous People (IP) students.

Tsinelas ni Tomas Project for Young Learners in Albay

Led by Two Silver Coins Charity Volunteers Inc. with Pamana of Allen,

Texas, USA, AFPFC MPC took part in the Tsinelas ni Tomas Project 23 (Year 3) on June 14, 2025, in Barangay Bautista, Jovellar, Albay.

A total of 136 learners from Talubo Bautista Elementary School benefited from the activity, receiving school essentials to support their educational well-being. Learners were provided with school bags, slippers, school supplies, fruit snacks, and pre-packed meals, with AFPFC MPC donating dental kits to help promote oral hygiene among the students.

Career and Personal Development Seminars for Students
